You will be receiving this information because you will be attending a Woodland Play Centre event. Most events and parties will entail playing outdoors, exploring, getting muddy and dirty, playing with natural elements and loose parts. Therefore you will need to come prepared!

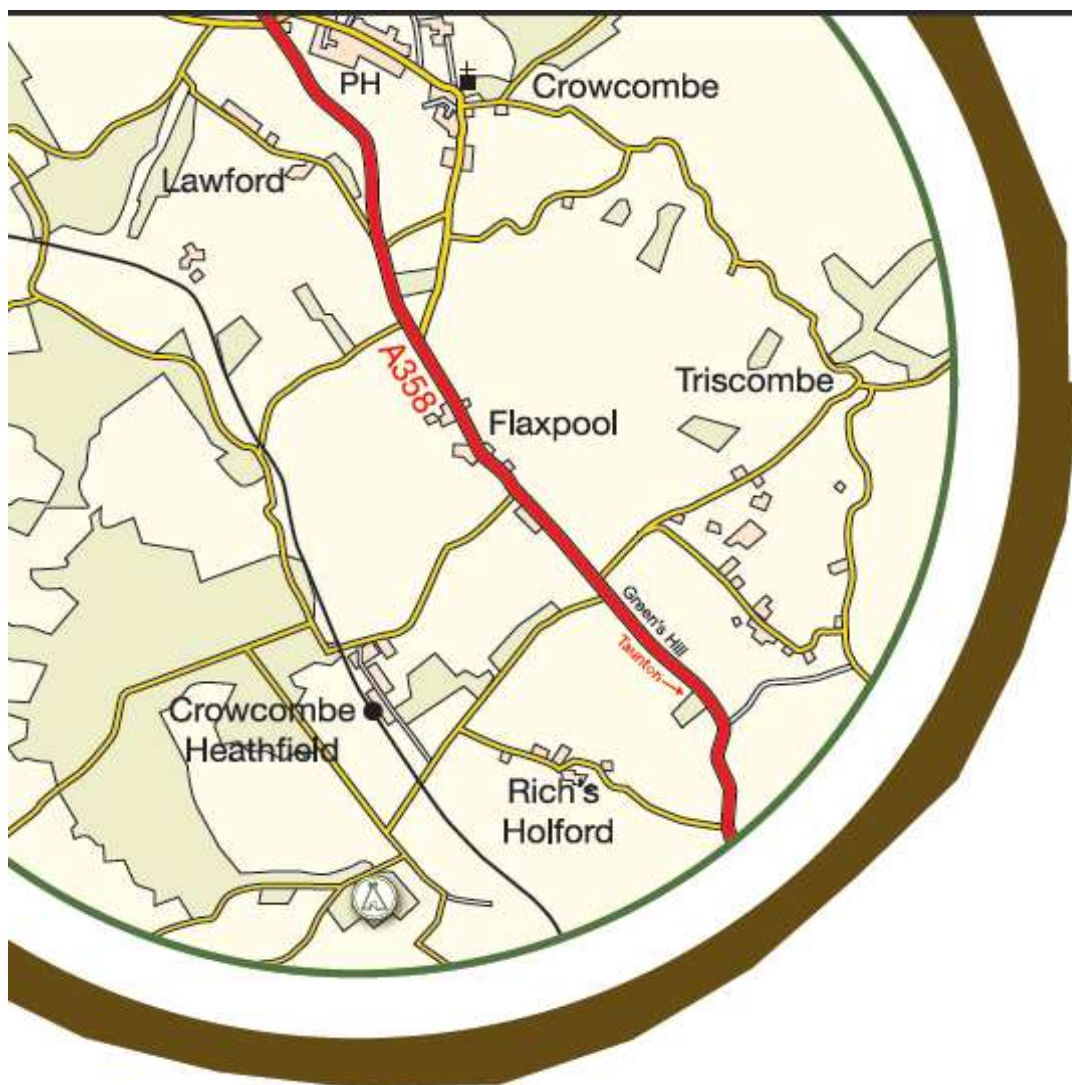
Wear; warm (old) clothes, bring waterproof coat / trousers, sturdy footwear (walking or Wellington boots), hat and gloves. For children a full change of clothes is advisable – remember there is no such thing as bad weather just bad clothing! Perhaps a bin liner to sit on in the car if very wet weather!

Directions

A map and road directions are below, to help avoid congestion & confusion on arrival please ensure you read our simple guidelines;

- When you reach the stoned entrance into the woods on your left, turn in and you will see two gateways. You need to **drive in through the lower gate** (on the left as you look at them) and not block the entrance or track into the other gateway.
- Park inside the lower gate entrance to the woods on the stoned area. Please park as tidily as possible to allow other cars to park too.
- Do not drive down the mud track. The woods are a CAR FREE ZONE. If possible try not to block the mud track, in case access is required for emergency services.
- If you need a quick get-away and do not want to get blocked in, it maybe wise to park outside the woodland. If doing so, please do not block the road, as it can be a busy lane with traffic and farm machinery.
- There are a few good places to pull in and safely park, so it is safe to un-load your children. Just before arriving at the woodland, coming from the A358 you will drive under a canopy of trees. On the left there is a pull-in under the beech trees and next to a newly planted hedge. Park here and walk up the road to the gateway. Alternatively, drive past this pull-in and as the road starts to sweep to the left, the entrance to the woods will be on your left. Here there is a turning on the right (there is a little grass triangle). Turn right and just up the lane is a grass verge on the left. Cars can be temporarily park there.
- Please do not use the postcode for the registered address in your sat-navs to find the woodland; it will take you to the wrong place!
- We are sorry to cause inconvenience but dogs are not allowed in the woods, unless prior permission is sought from Louise. We are on the edge of the Quantock Hills and there are good walking opportunities there. We can point you in the right direction if you are un-familiar with the area. Thank you.

You will be met at the car park by the Playworkers who will be leading the adventurous journey, so please contain your excitement and wait until you are collected!



Directions:

On the A358 from Taunton to Minehead, pass Seven Ash and follow the road up to the top of Greens Hill. On the brow of the hill turn left into Red Post Road, which is signposted to Crowcombe Station & Lydeard St. Lawrence. Follow the road over the railway bridge and around a sharp left bend and then another bend to the right. Drive under the tree canopy for about 300 metres until you reach the first gateway on the left and you have arrived. There are a few pull-ins near the gateway, please use these so not to block the road.
